Lord, Help Us... A Look at Our Summer Sermon Series

This summer we take a break from telling the big story of the Bible. The big story of God's redemptive love for the world is powerful and incredibly important of course, but not every part of the Bible is part of the story line. That's why we are going to take the summer and look at three different parts of scripture that are off the beaten path of the story.

Part One: Lord, Teach Us to Pray

One of the core pieces of our Christian identity is found in *the Lord's Prayer*, especially as it is found in Matthew 6:9-13. It is one of those things that unites all Christians

around the globe. We say it every week here at Grace. The problem with something that is so familiar is that it can become rote and lose its meaning. We will spend five weeks (May 25/26 – June 22/23) looking closely at these familiar words, and see that there are deep riches buried in them that we might miss in its familiarity. Get ready for your prayer life to be ignited!

Part Two: Lord, Give Us Wisdom

There is buried treasure in the Old Testament. If you open your Bible to the exact middle you will find a group of books that are a collection of Hebrew poetry. These books are known as the Wisdom Books. They don't tell a story, instead they are the collection of Israel's greatest hits of songs and poems.

This summer we will spend six weeks (June 29/30 – August 3/4) looking at nuggets of wisdom from two of the Wisdom books: the book *Proverbs* and the book of *Ecclesiastes*. Both of these books show us how one generation passes wisdom to the next generation. Proverbs records the wisdom of a young father to his young son. It is full of bright-eyed, optimistic wisdom that is important for young people who are starting out in life. Ecclesiastes, on the other hand, records the wisdom of an old, world-worn father who gives deep wisdom to his middle-aged son. It might seem depressing at times, but it shows us deep truths about how the world really is. In both cases, you will be encouraged to deepen your faith in God's wisdom for your everyday life.

Part Three: Lord, Make us the Church

We will finish out the summer by spending four weeks (August 10/11 – August 31/ September 1) in *Paul's letter to the Ephesians*. This letter talks about what it means to be the church and how to become a vital, healthy community. It is packed full of practical advice for how we can break down the barriers that stand between us and become the unified body of Christ, in the power of God's Spirit that God intends for us to be.

Yes, it is summer. Yes, you might be gone for many of these weeks. That's OK. Make sure you attend worship when you are here so that we can all learn and grow together. Remember, if you have to miss a week, you can always catch the sermons online at *www.graceandover.org/messages.html*

Savor the Summer!

The bulletin board near the Worship Center is a great reminder..."Savor the Summer!" I don't know

how you're feeling, but after such a long cold winter, I want summer to linger! I want it to continue and hang around for awhile! I want to **SAVOR** the slow, relaxed, and less-hectic pace!



Unfortunately, summer is going by much too quickly at Grace! Vacation Bible School is almost over and we had a great week of "climbing to the top of God's mountains!" Next on the schedule is Walk4Water with Prairie Oak Community Church. Before we know it, it will be time to send off our kids to Luther Dell or on the Wind River Youth Mission Trip.

Furthermore, I hope it will give me a deeper compassion for the difficulty so many people in our world face living in poverty.

I hope to find some other ministry opportunities to help me "savor" the summer. Perhaps a few sessions at Feed My Starving Children or a couple evenings with the Garden Ministry will get me out of the rut of everyday life to focus beyond myself. As I've learned in the past, when I do take the time to serve others, life always "tastes" better.

So join me! Take a walk down the hallway and look at the bulletin board. Spend a few moments there to consider the ministry opportunities we have this summer at Grace. Are there any there which will help you "savor" and enjoy the summer a bit differently? Think it over. Pray about it. Try it!

A huge THANK YOU goes out to the volunteers who are assisting on the Mowing and Grace Gardens teams this summer. They are working hard to keep the grounds looking beautiful. If you see them working outside, please take a moment to thank them for all their efforts.

Last spring following the Vision Board and Leadership Retreat where we reflected on the Focus 20/20 Vision, a team was established to research the potential for a fund drive. One year later in association with the Free 2B Grace Stewardship Campaign, we have held eighteen Focus Group Meetings, completed a successful Campaign Kickoff Event, published monthly Grace Notes articles, sent weekly Grace At A Glance emails, shared numerous worship service updates, made several hundred phone calls, and presented the Free 2B Grace Stewardship Vision to 250+ Grace families. Wow! What an eventful year!

Twenty-five committed, dedicated, and incredible volunteers, have worked on our core values "weEquip, we-Serve" & "weConnect" with every family here at Grace. There have been many wonderful relationships established, stories shared, and lives impacted during this journey. The team will continue to work on connecting with the remainder of the families over the summer. When you receive a call from the team, please be willing to meet with them to hear the vision of being a ministry of Grace in the Heart of Andover and Beyond!

While this is a *five year* stewardship campaign, we have started to address a few deterioration issues with our property. New sidewalks have been poured in front of the Worship Center with plans to replace more sections in front of the Education entrance. In the parking lot, pot holes have been repaired, the parking lot has been swept, and the lines repainted with two additional handicap parking spots. We will continue to save money to address the worship center roof and brick tuck pointing.

So far this year in our Capital fund, each month we have been short of making our mortgage payment by \$2,200 on average. However, the good news is the Free 2B Grace Stewardship Campaign has helped us meet this monthly shortfall. We also expect to make our first "additional" mortgage principle payment later this month. We have been wonderfully blessed in the first months of the Free 2B Grace Stewardship Campaign to begin working on the top issues discussed in the Focus Group Meeting and the personal visits! Our prayer is that more of the Grace family will come alongside us as we continue to move forward with the Campaign. Blessings to you and your families this summer! 3

New Parish Nurse Ministry:



As Pastor Mark mentioned in last month's Grace Notes, we are embarking on a new ministry here at Grace: Parish Nursing. It's an exciting opportunity to explore our faith in a new way. This program has been carefully and prayerfully prepared and planned by Lori Ackerson and myself. Although, you may be wondering

what parish nursing is.

Holistic care or nursing has been around since the earliest civilizations and focused on treating a person's mind, body and spirit, integrating each cultures belief system as a way to heal. Along the way, medicine has separated into the secular realm, which focused on treating the body or disease, but left the person alone to find meaning. Flash forward to 1984, when Rev. Granger Westberg had the vision to plan and implement institutional-based parish nursing programs. This formalized the role of the nurse within the church, and created support networks between parish nurses. With this support and guidance, the parish nurse became an established and invaluable asset to the church for which they serve.

The parish nurse performs seven functions within the church: integrator of faith and health, personal health counselor, referral agent, health educator, health advisor, coordinator of volunteers, and developer of support groups. This allows for a wide range of possibilities of practice for the parish nurse, and many ways to care for the wellness of the congregation.

Lori has been a registered nurse for 13 years and in health care for 20 years. She became a nurse after her family's first -hand experience with the health care system when her younger brother had a kidney transplant at the age of 8. She has been in a variety of roles at the bedside and in administration in hospitals, but her true love is educating and supporting people through the complex world of health care.

Likewise, I became a nurse 9 years ago to care for the people in my life, as well as the patients who I worked with. Originally, I started working as a nurse in direct patient care, but grew to love public health nursing and specifically parish nursing as a way to care for the entire person and teach preventive health.

Our vision for a parish nursing program at Grace is to be a resource, to encourage the holistic well-being of its congregants, and to lead them as followers of Jesus Christ.

Lori and I feel truly blessed to have been called to serve as parish nurses at Grace and look forward to working with the congregation to support, encourage and maintain a feeling of wellness in mind, body, and spirit!
