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## **Pastor Mark's Remarks:**



#### November is the Countdown!

Did you hear the story about the man who hadn't been feeling well? Tired, listless, and sensing things weren't quite right, he decided to go to his doctor for a complete check-up. Afterward, the doctor came out with the results. "I'm afraid I have some very bad news," the doctor says. "You're dying, and you don't have much time left."

"Oh, that's terrible!" said the man. "How long have I got?" "Ten," the doctor said sadly. "Ten?" the man asked. "Ten what? Months? Weeks? What?!" The doctor interrupts, "Nine..."

Well...in case you're a bit worried, the countdown I'm writing about is not ten seconds and counting! No, it's going to be much longer than that! In fact, it's going to be a whole month-long as we countdown 500, 400, 300, 200 and 100 in our November marathon of SERVING!!!

I can't remember another November when we've planned to serve in so many different ways. In the past couple of years, we have chosen a Feed My Starving Children Marathon weekend as a major way to grow our discipleship habit of SERVING. Each time, I have been amazed at the large number of people who show up to help pack meals to feed hungry children. But more than that, I'm amazed that we learn a bit more about what it means to serve beyond ourselves. I'm convinced these yearly November marathon serving events have been important spiritual tools God has used to teach us that we have too much, while so many in our world have so little!

And now we want to grow our serving to include 400 Operation Christmas Child boxes, 300 used coats for Hope 4 Youth, 200 mittens for our caring partnership with Sand Creek Elementary School, and 100 volunteers for Family Promise during Thanksgiving week. And I can't help but think this month of serving will make a huge impact in our community, as well as in our own lives. Let's face it, one of the chief ways in which God's Spirit grows us deeper, is in the ways we empty ourselves in order to serve and love others!

For me, serving is connected to following Jesus. One of the Bible verses I use most to center and focus myself is Mark 10:45. It comes as the disciples argue about greatness. Jesus' words to them always cut me to the heart: "Whoever wishes to become great among you must be your servant, and whoever wishes to be first among you must be slave of all. For the son of Man came not to be served, but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many."

I believe, if we are going to follow Jesus we must be like him and SERVE.

This is why I'm excited about November's countdown to serving! I believe God can do great things in us as we follow Jesus' example to serve beyond ourselves. So...join me as we begin the countdown! 500! 400! 300! 200! 100! Blastoff to serve!!

Are you interested in Spiritual Formation?

Does the idea of gathering with people from other congregations, engaging in an interactive, action-based learning environment and learning more about spiritual formation in the suburbs sound interesting to you? Do you have six Monday nights--starting February 24 through March 31, 2014--available to gather with this group? Are you willing to lead a project in our congregation next year that will help Grace grow in spiritual formation?

If you answered "yes" to the questions above, then I have an exciting opportunity for you. Next year I will be launching a research project that will become the core of my PhD dissertation. I will gather a group of people from three ELCA congregations to learn about spiritual formation in the suburbs. This group will come up with a plan to help each local congregation to engage in an action project that will help the congregation experience spiritual formation in a new way. This process is called *Action Research* (you can Google it if you want to see how it is used in research all around the world).

The research project is called *Deep in the Burbs*. I will be posting all my findings on the website www.deepintheburbs.com. The site is already up and contains all of the research I've been doing during my two years in the PhD program at Luther Seminary. If you are interested in joining me in this adventure, please contact me at stevet@graceandover.org. The group is limited to twelve people from Grace. We will have an informational meeting in the next few weeks. Please watch for this announcement.

#### **History Buffs Needed!**

There is another way you can be involved in the *Deep in the Burbs* project. I will be doing historical research on the cities of Anoka, Coon Rapids, and Andover. If you like history, research, and good conversation, then I invite you to be a part of my history research team. We will gather every other week to share our findings, have good coffee, and learn more about what God has done in this area. This team is separate from the Action Research team mentioned above.

I would like to thank you, the Grace Congregation, for your continued support over the last two years as I have been buried in classes, books, and papers. Your kindness and your willingness to let me be distracted by this process has been so encouraging to me that words cannot describe it. Missing just one week can make it more difficult for the child and can extend the adjustment period. Try to be there every week. (I know it's tough at times, but do try!)



**SONday School Memory Champs** – In addition to our year long memory work, every two months, we are learning a Bible verse set to music in our Large Groups.
