Grace*Link* Update

It's been exciting as we've launched our new Online Grace Community called GraceLink. Maybe you have heard of GraceLink during worship services or even logged in to give it a try. At any rate we are excited as we take another important step to grow deeper connections at our church.

What is the purpose of GraceLink? When you join this online extension of the Grace Community you can:

- Find addresses and phone numbers of various members of our church. Gone are the days of printed church directories!
- Connect with various serving ministry opportunities, join a small group, or register for special events.
- Connect with people on your serving team or small group for prayer or encouragement.
- Give online, even when you're unable to attend worship.
- Download the Church Life App on your phone and stay connected no matter where you go!

GraceLink is completely secure and accessible to only members and friends of Grace who sign up and join our online community. We're just beginning to introduce it now. Keep watch as we grow our connections at Grace.

How Many Are Presently a Part of Gracelink?

- We presently have **209** active members who have logged in, signed up for Simply Giving, registered for VBS, or shared contact information for other members of Grace.
- We have about **45** families who have signed up for the new Simply Giving GraceLink program. (We had about 90 families who gave regularly online through the old Simply Giving program.)
- We estimate about 70% of those who registered their children for VBS have done it through GraceLink.

Dare to Dream the Big Dreams

Pastor Mark's Remarks

Alexandra Cousteau, granddaughter of the famous ocean explorer Jacques Cousteau, was marvelous! Her recent commencement address at my son's graduation from Luther College was fantastic. Sharing a defining moment of epic failure in her personal life, she challenged the graduates to use their epic failures as a launch pad to dream epic dreams to solve, overcome, and workout whatever problems and setbacks are in the world today! Like I said, it was a marvelous speech!

Since then, I have reflected upon moments when Grace has dared to dream epic dreams. Whether they first came as a result of a failure, or an attempt to ask: *"What new thing is God asking us to do?"* Each time we have dared to dream big dreams, God has blessed, changed, and deepened us in the marvelous flow of his love!

Two of these past moments easily come to my mind: Golden Rule Day Care and investing in Adult Faith Formation with Pastor Steve. Let me explain.

Did you know we were just about ready to close Golden Rule about 7 years ago? It was after the economic downturn in 2008 & 2009. Enrollment was very small (about 6 full-time students), our acting Preschool Director had been let go, staff morale was at a new all-time low, and the church had assumed most of the facility costs. In addition, several new and larger daycare centers had been built in the surrounding area. We were not sure whether the Golden Rule Daycare could survive.

But we dared to dream a big dream. We hired Tami Mielke to rebuild the program. And rebuild it, she did! Equipped with a vision to bring a deeper Christian aspect to Golden Rule as well as strengthen the curriculum and expand the program, Tami and her talented staff has transformed our daycare. It is now bursting at the seams. And Grace has benefited as we've partnered with Golden Rule to recarpet, paint, install new ceiling tiles, and build an outdoor classroom/garden. Dreaming has paid off! We're not only expanding the toddler program into our Nursery facility in July, but we're also starting a Christian Preschool in September in one of our portable classrooms.

The other dream we dared to dream last year was calling Pastor Steve full time to invest in Adult Faith Formation. Unlike the daycare dream, which started during a difficult moment, this one was the result of the growing success we had already experienced in Sunday Evenings@GRACE. And, like many dreams, this one prompted us to dream again and we called Kristi Larson as Director of Youth and Family to relieve Pastor Steve of his responsibilities in youth ministries. Once again, dreaming has paid off with new opportunities and growth. We've run out of room on Wednesday nights! Already crowded with our Catechism, Rockin' Kids Club, and Adult Choir ministries, Pastor Steve's additional Wednesday evening class, as well as our Family Pizza Night in the Narthex has really made things tight! And now, people are asking for more adult classes on Wednesday evenings! And all I can say is this: "Isn't it great when we dare to dream big!"

However, big dreams ask for big investments. For instance, the increased enrollment in the Day Care as well as growth in adult participation in Faith Formation opportunities on Wednesday Evenings has "shrunk" our facilities. We are challenged to find room to handle the growth. This challenge is forcing us to ask hard questions:

- What program and/or ministry can be rescheduled, changed, or moved to make more room?
- What are we going to do in three years when we are no longer permitted to have portable classrooms? Are we going to build permanent structures? If so, where?

We are also finding that big dreams cost money. Calling Pastor Steve full-time and hiring Kristi have significantly increased our staff expenditures. Unfortunately, while our offerings have remained steady over the last year, we have not increased our giving to meet what we need. What's more, although there has been an increase to our Free 2B Grace Fund, we cannot use these capital improvement/ debt reduction funds to pay for our increased staffing cost. This is leading us to ask hard questions:

- What staffing responsibilities/changes need to be made?
- Are we able to enlist more people to begin Simply Giving online to help build consistent offerings despite lower summer worship attendance?
- How do we ask people to take a step to increase their offerings?

I believe God calls all of us to risk and to dream big dreams. Whether we're a church, a business, or an individual. Big dreams bring great things because they challenge us to take steps to trust, risk, try and believe God will provide all we will need. The question is this: will we take the first step?

Still dreaming the big dreams!

A twelve-session course that walks you through the entire Bible. What is the Bible? Why is it important? What is the big story of the Bible? How does this story connect to our lives today? These are the questions that Bible Mania addresses. Plus, it's lots of fun!

OMG! Can We Talk about God?

An introduction to God that helps us learn how to have these discussions without killing each other. Do

you know what you believe and why you believe it? This course will help you think about these things.

Beginnings: The Books of Moses

Dig into the first five books of the Bible: Genesis, Exodus, Leviticus, Number, Deuteronomy. These are the stories that have shaped the Jewish and Christian Faith. You can't really understand Jesus without knowing these stories.

The Gospel of Mark

This course tracks with the sermon series from January – March, 2016. What did Jesus mean when he said, "The Kingdom of God is at hand, repent and believe the good news?"

Volunteers, who are not even biologically connected to the children, help raise them in schools, and with sports. Mentors and friends also help raise children.

Proverbs 22:6 reads "Train a child in the way he should go, and when he is old he will not depart from it."

At Grace Lutheran, we believe this verse to be true and actively are raising/training children. We provide Christian education, leadership, encouragement, and love. We don't stop with children. Every day we, as a village, also support adults. The work, here in the heart of Andover, never ends.

Here are some facts to prove that we are hard at work with kids and adults. Volunteers are used in all areas of "our village."

Youth Ministries

90 volunteers who work directly with Middle School and High school aged youth

Children's Ministries

43 people work with the SONday School program, 150 are involved with our summer Vacation Bible School, 60 individuals staff the nursery, and 16 work with Rockin' Kids Bible Club and/or Music Camp

WOW (Women on Wednesdays)

10 women lead more than 50 women in Bible Studies

Connect Class

10 Grace members give people information about Grace, many of which join as members

GRAMPS (Grace's Resourceful Able Men Performing Service)

10 men regularly do light maintenance and repair to the church building and grounds

Family Promise

More than 70 people help during the weeks that Grace provides housing and meals for homeless families

Grace Choir

24 people volunteer their time and talent in providing music to our worship services

Funeral Ministry

15 people help shop, cook, and serve funeral luncheons

Musical Worship Team

20 people provide musical support at 2 of our services

Quilters

About 15 women lovingly create quilts that are donated to

Family Promise families, hospitals, hospice centers, and for children baptized at Grace

Worship

About 150 people help make worship services meaningful and successful by ushering, reading, serving communion, providing sound and projection, counting offering, decorating, etc.


