Confession Time

Pastor Mark's Remarks

I have a confession to make... I don't know all the names of the people who live on my street! In fact, I don't think I could recognize them all, no matter how many times they drive past my house! And what makes it even harder to confess... I don't live on a big street. There are only 18 homes total! For a pastor who is known for his ability to recall names at church and connect with people, it is humbling to realize I don't have many connections and relationships with the people I live the closest to.



This neighborhood disconnect seems strange to me. When I was a kid, I knew everyone in my much larger neighborhood of 50 to 75 homes! Unlike today, I remember we were better connected and had a closeness so much different than my present neighborhood. Back then we knew everyone's names, both kids and adults. We knew the cars each family drove. We knew each others' pets, and even knew what church they attended. We felt safe and well-connected. When I went out on Halloween to trick and treat, everyone knew who I was. Since my family home had a large front porch on which we played on all the time, it was easy to connect and talk with neighbors as they walked by.

This closeness had its pluses and minuses. The plusses? I felt safe and secure. I felt connected and part of the whole community. I had a place! I felt accepted. The minuses? I couldn't get away with much. If I did something wrong, I knew it would not be long until my parents knew all about it. There were few secrets in our close knit neighborhood.

I sometimes find myself desiring that same connectedness in my neighborhood today, as I realize how little I have. My neighborhood disconnectedness makes it almost impossible to share about the most important thing in my life...God! If I am a Christ-follower who is living his life in praise and thanksgiving for God, who seeks to be a peacemaker, and someone who is to witness to the saving grace found in Jesus Christ, how can I do that effectively to the people around me, if I don't have relationships with them? They will never take me or what I say about God seriously, unless they really know me for who I am.

This is why I'm excited about the November Loving Generously series we have at Grace. I think I need to be challenged and stretched by its basic message: we can't really say we love God unless we also strive to love our neighbors, no matter where they may be....close by, at school or work, in our community, or beyond. I believe this Loving Generously series will teach all of us a whole new kind of generosity - a generosity of relationships!

What is great about this series is that it's not all talk but also includes actions. At the end of the series, we will be asked how we might take some small action steps of building such relationships in simple ways...a dinner or dessert with a neighbor in your home; an invitation to meet someone from school or work for coffee; or some other kind of connection in order to make yourself available to simply love someone generously.

I hope you will make worship a priority during November as

we take steps to love more generously. I think the message of loving generously is something we all need.

I also pray you will consider sharpening some of your serving skills, and serve in one of our special serving event: Family Promise, Family Table, Operation Christmas Child, Feed My Starving Children Marathon Event, donating food for Hope 4 Youth, or giving food for a family at Sand Creek Elementary School at Thanksgiving. Together God can use the worship series and these serving events to grow us more into people of grace in the heart of Andover and beyond.

Alignment

A Note from Pastor Steve

If you could condense our theme for spiritual formation at Grace this fall into one word, it would be: *alignment*.

The body of Christ is a wonderfully diverse and complex

organism. That is very evident here at Grace. We have many different people with many different gifts at Grace. We are all following the Spirit's leading to serve the church and the world in many different ways. This is good and this is how it should be.

However, every once in a while it is good to take a body to the chiropractor and get things back



into alignment. That's what we are trying to do through our *Loving Generously* Sermon Series and Small Groups. I am very excited to report that we have small groups meeting in our high school ministry, women's ministry, men's ministry, and on four nights of the week in adult ministries...all studying the same thing for five weeks. That is *alignment*.

I don't think we can underestimate the positive effects this alignment will have on our body. When a skilled chiropractor twists and pops the spine it allows the electrical impulses to flow more freely through the nervous system, and promotes healthy bodily functions. In the same way, I believe this alignment through Loving Generously will create spaces of communication throughout our body that will allow the Holy Spirit to move freely in and among us, to prompt us to grow in healthy—and generous—ways.

Nov. 21/22 Christ the King FMSC Serving Weekend All Services This weekend marks the end of the church year and our Loving Generous Journey, when we celebrate that Jesus is the King of all things, AND that the best way of loving him is by loving others generously. We have lots to celebrate on our Feed My Starving Children Marathon Serving Weekend. There will be many exciting stories to share, as we give thanks for the opportunity to touch and change the lives of countless hungry children in our world! Nov 29/30 1st Advent All Services We will welcome Seminarian Corey Lange to lead us into our Advent Season to prepare for Christmas. The theme of worship is: A TIME FOR VISION as we focus on the message of the Old Testament prophet: Habakkuk.

Advent Begins at the End of November



November is also the time in which we begin a new church year with Advent, a four week countdown to prepare for Christmas. It is an important

start to the church year because it reminds us that time is precious and we need plenty of it to welcome Jesus into

our lives...like at Christmas. So often we feel like we've run out of time in the busyness of Christmas preparations. That's why we need Advent, as it invites us to slow down as we prepare to grasp once again, the significance of Christmas. Therefore, our theme centers on time: FOR SUCH A TIME AS THIS.

The traditional "feel" of the Advent season can be described as a bit more subdued with special emphasis on preparation, waiting, and self-examination. We resist singing Christmas Carols until just before Christmas. We use an Advent Wreath to focus us on the passage of time instead of putting up the Christmas trees. In Advent we

hold back from running quickly to Christmas, as we try to experience the long period of time God's people waited for the promise of the Messiah to be born.

Advent Wreath

One of the ways in which we wait and focus on time in our home is through a family Advent Wreath. These wreaths have four candles that invite families to take a few moments of time to connect, share, read a short passage of scripture, and pray together as the candles are lit. It's a wonderful way for children to "countdown" the weeks before Christmas. But more than that, it's a great way to build and connect the family for just a moment in the hectic pace of the season.

At Grace, we offer an Advent Wreath Making Event on Sunday, Nov.30th. We provide you with a kit including candles and evergreens. There is more information about it on page 9 of the Grace Notes. Please remember to bring your own pruning shears or scissors, and also decorations, such as ribbon, pine cones, etc.
