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Grace Plants a Vineyard

Growing Our Ministry to the Community



What are all those sticks doing on the land next to the Andover Community Gardens?" Here's the simple answer to that frequently asked question...

Each individual stick will support a grapevine recently planted in the vineyard on land owned by Grace Lutheran Church.

This five acre vineyard will be managed by Twin Rivers Winery from Ramsey, MN. Owner Mark Hedin (a member of Grace) has agreed to donate 10% of all proceeds to local community needs, and the surrounding neighborhood will have a voice in where these funds will be distributed in the years ahead. When the vineyard begins to produce grapes, Grace will contact the nearby neighbors to vote to determine which community agency, ministry or activity will receive the fund. None of the proceeds of the vineyard will be contributed to our budget.

Our successful partnership with the City of Andover with the Andover Community Gardens will continue on this parcel of land as well.

Why plant a vineyard? Why host a community garden. It is our desire is to be good stewards of this land and to seek ways to make a difference in our community.

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Celebrating the gifts of Grace Pastor Mark's Remarks

I may be a bit prejudice, but I think we have some amazingly generous people at Grace. That's right! We have people who willing give and give their time and energy to do all kinds of things, and am constantly amazed at the results!

For instance, I am thinking of those who bake, prepare, serve meals for families devastated by the loss of a loved one. I don't think most Grace members realize the incredible ministry the women and men (mostly Graceful Seniors) who work so hard to welcome families and friends after a funeral and serve a meal...that is, not until you yourself experience the loss of a dear family member. It's then you understand that a Funeral Reception Team is a visible embrace of grace from the Lord a time when you need it the most.

At Grace we have such a team headed up by Jan Quick and Jan Galvin. As

soon as they learn about a funeral they start calling and planning for people to bake bars, prepare sandwiches, coleslaw, and veggies, and decorate the Fellowship Hall. Often times, the team prays for the family as they work in the kitchen and they always try to reach out with comfort and grace to those they serve. I sometimes I sit back and watch them. I am just amazed at the ways in which they give! And I'm told over and over again by the families who much the funeral reception team has touched them.

Another way I have been amazed is how generosity comes in the simplest ways...even in the form of a paint brush! Yes...I talking about the recent group of people who volunteered hours and hours to paint rooms in SONday School rooms and Day Care areas in preparation for new carpeting. Headed up by Alden Riley and his helper and wife Judy, the following people gave a lot to Grace through a paint brush: Dick Thompson, Larry Hirsch,, Becky Gerlach, Sue Melody, John Peterson, Johnnie

Tillery, Bruce Denney, and Tom Ryan.

It was a bit challenging to get all the painting done. They had to first wait until Vacation Bible School was over in order to sand, fill holes, remove coat racks and floor molding. Secondly they had to paint around the Day Care schedule so as to keep the paint fumes to a minimal. All of this meant our volunteers had to come to paint in the afternoons, evenings and weekends in order to get

it all done. What a big job! And what a big gift of generosity!

So won't you join me in celebrating the gifts God has given us through each other. It is wonderful to experience the generous ways of Grace!, isn't it!

Deepening Your Spiritual Roots This Summer

weGrow Deep Roots

There is one more month of summer left, and we want to soak up every bit of it that we can, right? While you are soaking up the summer sun, I'd like to plant some ideas in your mind. Our theme for the year is CULTIVATE: Making Room for God's Promise (Pastor Mark will tell us more about that), and the emphasis is spiritual formation. The big question we'll be asking all year is: What steps can we take in our lives to make room for the Spirit of God to work in and through us this year?

There are two keys ways that I hope to CULTIVATE our spiritual formation at Grace this year: SPACES and PATHWAYS. First, we need to cultivate new spaces where people can connect with each other for mutual encouragement, prayer, fellowship, and growth. I'm thinking especially about our emerging adults (the 20s-early 30s crowd) and our men's ministry.

Second, we need to create new pathways to help people understand how to grow deeper in faith. God's love is free and faith is a gift, but it isn't easy to grow in it. Where do we turn to find the help we need to deepen in our relationship with God, each other, ourselves, and the world?

There is not an easy, three-step answer to these questions. However, I am excited about a new resource that is taking root on our website. I encourage you to go to graceandover.org and under the resource menu, find the page called How to **Grow in Your Faith.** The text below is what you'll find there. I encourage you to visit the page and take the first steps. Let me know how it goes.

Step One: Take the Spiritual Habits Assessment (SHA)

The SHA is a 35-question survey that helps you evaluate the spiritual habits that you might focus on in the upcoming months.

Learn more about the Seven Habits of Spiritual Formation.

Step Two: Explore the different opportunities to connect, grow, and serve If you are in the early stages of your faith journey...

- The Journey: An 8-month spiritual journey designed for seekers and/or new believers to get a solid grounding in the Christian practices. (coming soon...)
 - Attend the next S.H.A.P.E. class. This course will help you discover how God has uniquely gifted you to be a vital part of what God is doing in and for the world. (coming soon...)
 - Take the Bible Mania Course online. This is a 12-lesson course that will give you a
 - solid introduction and overview of the Bible.

If you are new to the church and want to get connected...

• Sign up for the next Connect Class. This is a one-time opportunity to share a meal with other newcomers to Grace, hear the stories of Grace, and find out how to get connected.

If you are a growing Christian and want to dig a little deeper...

• Explore the various Adult Ministries and Serving Opportunities at grace.

Join the next Session of Sunday Evenings @ Grace. This is an opportunity to choose from a smorgasbord of adult education opportunities.

Have you thought about trying something new?

- *Sunday School rooms are being painted. I absolutely love the grey color that was chosen!



After dinner, Pastor Mark led a Bible study on the Parable of the Soils. (Mark 4:1-20). This was a way for the board to consider next year's study of the Gospel of Mark.

The first item of business was the election of the new Vice President of the Board. Greg Ackerson was unanimously elected as the 2015-2016 Vice President. Jessie Crooks will continue on as Secretary. Tari Yates is the current Vision Board President.

The board planned out the hosting of the Fellowship Time on July 19th between services.

The rest of the meeting focused upon:
