

### Advent - A Time to Practice the Third Discipleship Habit

#### **Pastor Mark's Remarks**

Devote yourselves to prayer, keeping alert in it with thanksgiving. (Col. 4:2)

I've had some of my greatest successes and biggest defeats with Grace's third Discipleship Habit: Pray and Read Scripture Daily. I don't know if I'm normal or not . . . but I find this habit particularly challenging in the midst of a busy family life and hectic schedules.

#### I STRIVE to:

 wake up early in the morning, grab a cup of coffee and head to the family room for a time of Bible reading. I have used for years, a devotional based on the Common Lectionary. It's my time for connecting with God.



- join the church staff for weekly prayers on behalf of the congregation.
- pray nightly with Jeannie before bed and I usually succeed, unless I fall asleep before we can get to prayer.
- pray every time I pass a church, lifting up the needs of the pastor, staff and the congregation.
- keep a favorite hymn or praise song in my head all week-long so that I can continually praise and give thanks to God.

I find the word "strive" particularly important to me because at times, this habit is so hard to do consistently. This is why Advent is so important to me for it reminds me how important this habit of daily prayer and scripture is to my spiritual walk.

As I reflect upon this habit, consistency makes my walk with the Lord more significant. When I connect consistently with the Lord in prayer and his Word, I can handle better the extremes of my days – the challenges, problems, interruptions, mistakes as well as the joys, successes and celebrations. I also believe that people around me find it easier to be with me when I connect regularly with the Lord. How? Well, I find forgiveness easier to share when I meditate and read about God's

forgiveness. I find it simpler to adjust my daily agenda when I read in the Scriptures about obedience and trust in God. I can handle the anxieties and worries better as I read about Peter walking on the water, or the disciples seeing Jesus multiply bread and fish into a meal for thousands.

In addition to having a quiet time to read scripture, I have discovered that prayer is a time for realignment . . . of

taking the concerns, worries and problems to the Lord for his help, insight, wisdom and encouragement. It's a time of asking for help, remembering Jesus' own prayer in the Garden of Gethsemane: "Not my will, but your will be done." It's not easy to do at times, but when I do, I see my concerns more from his view and not only mine. It makes my life easier.

So why am I still striving to be more consistent in my daily devotional life after years of being a Christian? Good question! I guess I'm like a lot of people. There's always at least one of the Seven Habits of Effective Disciples that we need to work on. However, I'm not going to simply give up striving for more consistency in prayer and daily Bible reading. I think it's something God is going to have to change and grow in my life. I guess this is why Advent is so important to me. It's the season that emphasizes prayer, self-reflection, and centering on God's Word. It's a time to slow down and wait, quietly preparing for Christmas. It is truly the season that God can use to shape and remold our hearts. It's something we all need.

So . . . the words of Paul written to challenge the Christians in the early church are also the words for me. But my question is this – are they also the words for you?

Devote yourselves to prayer, keeping alert in it with thanksgiving. (Col. 4:2)



# The End is Near! (of 2015 that is)



As we come close to the end of the year, we want to celebrate the generous ways in which the people of Grace give. How could the many ministries happen without the generosity of people giving their

time, skills, energy, and finances? What would our church be without our outreach through Family Table, Till All Are Fed Food Pantry, Family Promise, Our Savior's, Vacation Bible School, Hope 4 Youth, if not for your support? The mission of Grace would be very different without the outpouring of your generous love.

With only five more weeks left until December 31st (as this article is written), how does it look as we end the year? Will our generosity continue to overflow and fund our ministries? Will we finish the year financially strong or will there be a short-fall impeding the start of the new year? These are some of the "business side of the church" questions the leadership continues to pray about.

Here is a quick financial snapshot at the offerings given up to the middle of November.

For the rest of the year we will collect our benevolence tithe and repeat the same act of generosity of giving financial gifts to people in the surrounding area who are nominated by members of Grace. Whatever is left, the Vision Board will distribute it to ministries which already received Noisy Offerings during the year.

As we prepare for a great start to 2016, we would like to ask those who are able to consider making a year-end financial gift to help us end this year strong. We believe if we do, we will be able to make an important spiritual step in the next year as we finally reach a full 10% tithe beyond the walls of our church. This has been a goal our church has been working on for at least 12 years gradually increasing the percentage of money we give for benevolences. We're almost there as we have tithe 9.5% in 2015.

In addition to this important spiritual step, we want to fully support the gifted staff we have gathered to lead and encourage us in this ministry of Grace. We took a huge step in 2015 to increase Pastor Steve's hours to full-time and hire a full-time Director of Youth and Family. At the same time, we realize that Pastor Mark is still shouldering many of the responsibilities formerly done by our Church Administrator who resigned more than a year and a half

The question that remains is this: Will the offerings be large enough so all the outstanding bills will be paid?

We are thankful that all of our financial commitment of \$38,000 to the ELCA has been completed as well the \$4,000 support to Lutheran Social Services of Minnesota.

#### A Word From Vision Board

It never ceases to amaze me how many things we have going on at Grace, and how many ministries we have in our church. Some of our outreach ministries are focused on our neighbors, like Family Promise, Family Table, our partnership with Sand Creek Elementary, Funeral Luncheons, Grace Quilters, Hope 4 Youth, May All Be

Fed Food Shelf, the Pastoral Care Team, and the Prayer Shawl Ministry to name just a few. Some are focused on helping other who are further away, such as Feed My Starving Children, the Rakai Orphans, and our ongoing work and projects in Haiti. We are not a huge church, but we sure are busy!

It is humbling to be a part of a group of Christians who take their call to be the hands and feet of Christ literally. Especially when you consider that I have only mentioned about half of the ministries that our church is involved in!

I am writing today to talk briefly about another new ministry that has started in our church that many of you may not be aware of. On one of the Haiti mission trips that happened in March 2014, some of our church members met some children who had recently lost a parent in a landslide and had been abandoned. They were able to

meet the children and see them as they arrived out of the mountains; dirty and frightened.

During the last celebration of our Free 2 B Grace campaign, and the annual tithe of those offerings, the congregation elected to help support those same abandoned kids by paying for their housing, food, and

money that we were able to provide

education for one year. This is because of the generosity of our Grace family. None of this money came from our church budget, it all came from the tithe of Free 2 B Grace.

We now have a group of Grace members who have decided to make a longer lasting commitment to those same abandoned kids. We have a whole group of members working on creating a permanent home for those kids. There are currently 8 kids sleeping in a room the size of a closet. I am excited that we have the opportunity to create a "Place of Grace for our Haitian Children – our Abandoned Children Ministry". Watch for more information as God's plan for this ministry are discerned and take shape.

#### **GRACE 4 RAKAI updates**

NEWS FLASH & PRAISE GOD: 49 more children in Rakai, Uganda are being sponsored by people at Grace.... in just the past two months! WOW – what a BLESSING! To date, friends and families of Grace are sponsoring 72 beautiful children in Rakai, providing monthly financial support for education and medical needs to orphans and vulnerable children in Uganda, Africa.

VIDEO from UGANDA: Please go to front page of our church's website (graceandover.org) to view the video from Uganda "grace in mission." This video was shown in worship Nov. 14/15 and highlights the impact that is possible as we strive to share God's grace around the world.

MINISTRY TEAM: Just so you know, there is a ministry team called GRACE 4 RAKAI who is striving to listen, support, offer hope and love to the people of Rakai, Uganda, especially vulnerable women and children. Over the last four years, our church has been reaching out to Rakai by funding the Bakery Project, building two water containments, supporting the Nutritional Farming Initiative and sponsoring children through the African Children Today ministry.

FUTURE STEPS: So what is our next dream? What might be our next steps of sharing God's grace with the people in Rakai? We have begun praying for the means to build a school and dormitory for children in Rakai. And God is already blessing us with compassionate hearts and generous donations. And we are also exploring the possibility of a mission trip to Uganda next October.
